# 2. WAITING WITH HOPE AND FAITH

Both faith and hope are essential and inseparable in progressive sanctification.

    - 3. in fellowship with God (Rev. 21:3)
    - 4. in a new heaven and earth (2 Pet. 3:10-13).

      - a. He is the revealed glory of God the Father (Heb. 1:2-3).
      - b. He became a man to experience the worst parts of humanity (Heb. 2:6-10, 14, 18).
      - c. He learned subjection to the Father's will (Heb. 5:7-10).
      - d. He rose from the dead (Heb. 2:14).
      - e. He is our High Priest before God, greater than all other priests that were before Him (Heb. 5:1-4; 7:11, 20-27).

Application: When you need to speak to God, come boldly to the throne of grace, confident in your High Priest's work.
