INT	RODUCTION				
•	One of major themes of Hebrews is the danger of(falling away from the faith).				
	<ul> <li>Words for forsaking such as "draw back, fall away, let slip, neglect, depart, come short, fall, fail, turn out of the way" are common.</li> </ul>				
•	Like other warnings in the books, the last part of chapter 10 can be divid into two sections:

	<ul> <li>Key statement = "the just shall live by faith."</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>Vs. 26-31 = a sober warning to apostates.</li> </ul>				
I.	THE OF THE APOSTATES (VS. 26A)				
•	People who:				
	<ul> <li>Have the knowledge of the truth.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>"Receive" = grasp, take hold of the knowledge of the gospel, so they understand the gospel yet without believing it.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>But willfully = the sin of rejecting Christ.</li> </ul>				
•	The only people who can fulfill the first part of the description are those who have been the truth.				
•	Application: The hardest person to reach is the passive rebel who has long attended a good but remained uncommitted to Christ and then willfully walks away.

	THE OF THE APOSTATES (VS. 26B-27)				
•	Judgment and devouring fire of indignation = eternal judgment and eternal				
•	If you turn away from the precious blood of Christ, you have nowhere else to go to get yourself right with God.				
III.	THE OF THE APOSTATES (VS. 28-29)				
Α.					
•	He has underfoot the Son of God				
•	He has counted the blood of the covenant to be(common, not worth anything).				
•	He has the Spirit of grace ("done despite" = scoff o insult; so he has refused and mocked His convicting work).				

•	All together, he has offended the (Who gave His Son), the Son (Who shed His blood), and the Spirit (Who seeks to him to Christ).
