- <u>Type fulfilled</u>: God required the same kind of priceless ______ from Himself that He required from Abraham (John 3:16).
- E. The _____ of Abraham (vs. 17)
- His faith shone out like gold in the fires of testing because he

- <u>Gen. 22:3-10</u>:
 - \circ $\;$ Abraham got up early in the morning and obeyed God to the letter.
 - \circ _____ also willingly obeyed his father.
 - \circ "My son" = Isaac was to serve as the offering.
