Date:

- 1 and 2 Thessalonians were written in AD 51-52 (per extra-biblical records).
- 1 Corinthians was written:
 - After his second missionary journey (Acts 18:21-22).
 - After a brief trip to Antioch (Acts 18:23)
 - During his third missionary journey (Acts 19:1, 10-12; 1 Cor. 16:5-9).
 - From Ephesus before going to Corinth.
 - Around AD 55-56
- Between 1 & 2 Corinthians
 - to Corinth (1:16; 2:1; 13:1).
 - After coming into Macedonia on the way to Corinth (7:5)
 - After receiving good news from Titus (7:6)
 - AD 55-56 (same year as 1 Corinthians)

Recipients:

- Church at Corinth
 - This church was started on Paul's second missionary journey (Acts 18:1, 4-11).
- Corinth was an extremely corrupt city.

Book Content Overview:

- - He suffered in Macedonia while the Corinthians prayed for him (1:3-14).
 - Plans for a third visit (1:15-2:5)
 - Forgiveness after offence (2:6-11)
 - Concern for the Corinthians took Paul from Troas to Macedonia (2:12-17).
 - The Corinthians bore witness to Paul's apostleship (3:1-4).
- Apostolic (3:5-7:16)
 - Renew yourself daily in the glory of the Lord (3:5-4:18).
 - The Judgment Seat motivates Godly living (5:1-11).
 - A new, righteous creation (5:12-21)
 - Avoid offence in the church (6:1-7:1).
 - The Corinthians godly sorrow unto repentance made Paul happy (7:2-16).
- - Paul's letters were weighty but his presence was weak (10:1-18).
 - Paul's actions and revelations demonstrated his apostleship (11:1-33).
 - Paul's hard absentee letter was intended to bring the Corinthians back so he could be gentle when he came (13:1-10).
