•	Paul's letter to the Philippians indicates he was expecting news of release very soon (Phil. 2:23)

Key Theme: Vain Pursuits vs. Edification

• Conclusion: avoid vain babblings (6:20-21)

- Paul names several opposing pairs that contrast vain pursuits with good actions that edify the church
 - 1:4. Fables and endless genealogies vs. godly edifying
 - 1:6-7. Vain jangling vs. proper understanding of the law
 - 4:6-7. Profane and vain old wives' fables vs. faith and good doctrine
 - 4:7-8. Bodily exercise vs. godliness
 - 6:20. Profane and vain babblings and oppositions of science vs. the committed faith

Application: Don't be distracted by vain pursuits which distract from godliness.
