## Text: Gen. 6:11-22

IV. The $\qquad$ to the Ark (vs. 16, 18, 22)

1. $\mathbf{A}$ $\qquad$ door (vs. 16)—"the" door = the only one.
2. $\mathbf{A}$ $\qquad$ door (vs. 18)—Noah and his family would "come in" while others would remain outside.
3. $\mathbf{A}$ $\qquad$ door (vs. 19)—By "coming in" through the door, Noah and his family would be "kept $\qquad$ ."

- In those 3 ways, the entrance of Noah's Ark is a picture of the one and only door in God's Ark of eternal $\qquad$ , the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Where you stand in relation to that door makes a big difference:
A. To be "in Christ" is a place of:

1. No $\qquad$ of $\sin ($ Rom. 8:1)
2. Safety, security, and inseparable $\qquad$ (Rom. 8:3839)
3. $\qquad$ to an undying, glorified body (1 Cor. 15:22)
4. A new you, a new $\qquad$ , and a fresh, clean start (2 Cor. 5:17)
5. All $\qquad$ blessings (Eph. 1:3)
6. $\qquad$ , faith, and love (1 Tim. 1:14)
7. Salvation and eternal $\qquad$ (2 Tim. 2:10)
B. To be outside of or "without" Christ is a place of:
8. Spiritual $\qquad$ , unbelief, ignorance, unforgiveness, and no repentance (Mark 4:11-12)
9. Limited $\qquad$ and opportunity to enter in (Luke 13:24-25)
10. $\qquad$ and separation from God (Eph. 2:12)
11. $\qquad$ separation from God in hell (Rev. 22:14-15)

## Application

- In response to these truths, we should do exactly what Noah did (vs. 22).
- The good news of salvation in Christ is an invitation to be received but also a command to be $\qquad$ (2 Thess. 1:8-9, Acts 17:30-31).
