A. Manasseh's Reign.

C.Y. 3,490 – 3,545

 - iii. He was a wicked king (2 Kings 23:37).
 - iv. He became servant of _____ (2 Kings 24:1-5).
 - v. Succeeded by Jehoaichin (2 Kings 24:6).
- F. Jehoiachin's reign: C.Y. 3,589
- i. Succeeded Jehoiakim (2 Kings 24:8).
 - ii. Reigned 3 Months and 10 Days (2 Chron. 36:9).
 - iii. He was a wicked king (2 Kings 24:9).
 - iv. He was taken captive to Babylon (2 Chron. 36:5-8).
 - v. _____ installed Zedekiah (2 Kings 24:17).
 - vi. He was exalted in captivity (Jer. 52:31-34).
- G. Zedekiah's reign: C.Y. 3,590 – 3,601
- i. Installed by Nebuchadnezzar (2 Kings 24:17).
 - ii. Reigned 11 Years (2 Kings 24:18).
 - iii. He was a wicked king (2 Kings 24:19).
 - iv. He rebelled against Babylon (2 Kings 24:20).
 - v. He was _____ in Jerusalem's destruction (2 Kings 24:21-25:21).
- H. Jerusalem Destroyed C.Y. 3,601/586 B.C.
