

## ONCE FOR ALL

Text: Heb. 10:1-18

- Two main ideas about the once-for-all offering for sins accomplished by Christ on the cross with a detailed footnote from the Old Testament for each.

### I. THE ONCE-FOR-ALL \_\_\_\_\_ OFFERED BY CHRIST (VS. 1-10)

- Vs. 1-4, the \_\_\_\_\_ of Old Testament sacrifices.
- Vs. 5-10, the substance of Christ's \_\_\_\_\_ offered on the cross.
- Vs. 5-7 are a quotation from Ps. 40:6-8:
  - **The necessity for Christ** = animal sacrifices do not \_\_\_\_\_ God.
  - **The \_\_\_\_\_ of Christ** = "mine ears hast thou opened"
    - Opened = "to dig or dig out", referring to the formation of human ears in the human body.
    - Septuagint translated, "a body hast thou prepared for me" (how the verse is quoted in Heb.).
  - **The \_\_\_\_\_ of Christ** are found in a "volume of a book" written about Him = the Old Testament Scriptures.
  - **The delight of Christ** = to do the Father's \_\_\_\_\_ (John 5:30, John 8:29, Luke 22:42).
  - Application: The only reason you or I can delight to do God's will is because the \_\_\_\_\_ of Christ lives within and has written His Law on our hearts.
- Vs. 10, "by the which will" = the will of the Father that Christ should offer His body in death in our place as the once for all \_\_\_\_\_ for sins.

### II. THE ONCE-FOR-ALL \_\_\_\_\_ MADE AVAILABLE BY CHRIST (VS. 10-18)

- A once-for-all sacrifice provides a once-for-all \_\_\_\_\_ from sins.
- Vs. 11-18 contrast Old Testament priests with our Great High Priest:
  - Old Testament priests could never sit down because their work was never \_\_\_\_\_.
  - Our Great High Priest is \_\_\_\_\_ on the right hand of God, meaning His work is done, once for all.
- Vs. 14, "perfected forever" means:
  - Having a perfectly clean \_\_\_\_\_ for sins.
  - Being positionally perfect in our holy \_\_\_\_\_ before God.

- Being perfected through a process of daily \_\_\_\_\_.
- Will be completely perfect and forever freed from \_\_\_\_\_ in our glorified bodies.
- If you've been washed from sins, your sins are gone, you are forgiven, and you never need to be \_\_\_\_\_ again (John 13:8-10).
- The proof (vs. 15-17) = a quotation from Jer. 31:33-34.
  - If God has \_\_\_\_\_ your sins, you have no more need to offer sacrifices for those sins.

### CONCLUSION

- Application 1: Are you 100% sure you're forgiven, or do you still have the conscience of your sins, or any \_\_\_\_\_ in your heart that you are ready for heaven?
- Application 2: If you say you're saved, are you delighting to do the Father's \_\_\_\_\_?
  - \_\_\_\_\_ is the visible fruit of saving faith and the surest sign that you truly love the Lord (Matt. 12:50, 7:21, 1 John 2:3).
