Text: Heb. 10:24-25 • The progression of the author's three-fold invitation: o If you don't know Christ, you should \_\_\_\_\_ to If you have come to Christ, you should close to Him. o If you know and love Christ, and are living close to Him, you should care enough to help others stay close as well. I. THE PERSPECTIVE FOR PROVOKING (vs. 24A) A. The Meaning of Provoking Consider = "to \_\_\_\_\_, contemplate, notice, think about, take note of something (Heb. 3:1). Provoke = "to \_\_\_\_\_, stir someone up, poke, prod, incite to a course of action" (paroxysm). The \_\_\_\_\_ of Provoking It's not usually \_\_\_\_\_ to be provoked or to have to provoke someone else. Application 1: If you have someone willing to provoke you when you need it, don't get be resentful but \_\_\_\_\_ God for that person (Psalms 141:5). <u>Application 2</u>: If you have a responsibility to provoke someone else: Don't hold back because you're of how it might turn out. Don't be irritable, \_\_\_\_\_, or harsh in your approach (Jas. 2:13, 2 Tim. 2:24-25). C. The Prerequisite for Provoking One reason we don't effectively provoke one another is because we're not \_\_\_\_ one another. The admonition isn't addressed to the pastors or deacons but (vs. 19) to the "\_\_\_\_\_"; (vs. 24) to "one another." Applications: We should know others in church well enough to know how they are in spiritual growth. We should be taking \_\_\_\_\_ to get to know people well.
