Text: Heb. 11:23-29 The primary faith action of Moses highlighted in the text is one God expects of all believers, \_\_\_\_\_\_. Separation: Begins with the understanding that \_\_\_\_\_ is separate from this present, sinful world (Heb. 7:26, Ps. 11:4). Continues by understanding that God expects the same from His \_\_\_\_\_ (1 Pet. 1:14-16). Requires not the world (1 Jn. 2:15-17). The world of stuff that appeals to the sinful of the eyes, flesh, and pride; and the world of sin and sinners under the control of Satan. A very good and positive Bible word because we separate to \_\_\_\_\_ (2 Cor. 6:17-18). A place turned his back on to follow God. Four truths about Moses' separation from the world: MOSES WAS SEPARATED FROM THE WORLD BY HIS FROM BIRTH (VS. 23). Application: The world has \_\_\_\_\_\_ for your child, to destroy your child, but an important step of faith for parents is to say, "No, the world can't have my child" and to dedicate yourself to raising your child \_\_\_\_\_ and separate from the world. II. Moses Separated \_\_\_\_\_ FROM THE WORLD WHEN HE CAME OF AGE (VS. 24). Application: Young person, you also need to the separated life for yourself. o The question is, Will you identify with and love the world or Christ? III. Moses Separated Himself from All The World Had to Offer (vs. 24-27). Moses pleased God by turning his back on: A. Worldly status and \_\_\_\_\_ (vs. 24) Worldly sins and \_\_\_\_\_ (vs. 25) Why choose to suffer over enjoying sinful pleasures?

•	Vs. 26, "had respect" = to look away from all else so you can pay to one thing. Moses was looking forward to greater
	joys and greater, eternal rewards.
•	<u>Application</u> : Sin may seem pleasant for a very short time, but it will deceive you, enslave you, and kill you in the end.
	<ul> <li>The pleasure is short but the is sad and long.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>"The recompense of the reward" = Moses was banking on a different payday when he would receive his reward for straight from the loving hands of Christ.</li> </ul>
C.	Worldly (vs. 26)
•	Moses turned his back on material wealth so he could receive the reviling, hatred, and abuse of ungodly people who wanted nothing more than to see him dead.
•	Application: The purpose of your life is not to material wealth (Prov. 23:4-5, 1 Tim. 6:9-11, 7). Money is simply a tool with which to Christ.
D.	Worldly opinions, fears, and (vs. 27).
•	Moses made the most powerful man in world very angry, but he did not allow the of man to keep him from following Christ by faith.
•	<u>Application</u> : When worldly people mock, make fun, or try to entice us into their worldly ways, we must see the King, Christ.
	<ul> <li>The way to break free from the fear of man is to feel the greater fear of God and to desire to love and please Him first of all.</li> </ul>

•	Application: The only way to please God is to come to God by one way of faith in Christ (Heb. 10:19-22, 11:6).
