Key Word:

•

- Although there is no mention of God in the book of Esther, His chosen people form the center of the plot.
- To be a Jew was dangerous at a time when political opinion could be easily swayed against you.
- From the events in Esther, we discover that the Jews obviously maintained a unique lifestyle even though they were in the captivity.

•

- At the end of the story, Mordecai and Esther proclaimed that the Jews should remember that day with a feast.
- The Feast of Purim is still celebrated today.

Key Doctrines:

- Genesis 12:3, "And I will bless them that bless thee and curse them that curse thee."
- Haman was clearly Satan's tool for attempting to destroy Israel.
- God clearly fulfilled His promise to curse those that cursed Israel when He destroyed not just Haman but also his family.
- The Abrahamic Covenant still applies.

 - Esther's command is written in a book.
- The greatness of Mordecai (10:1-3)

Challenges to Esther:

- Why is God not mentioned anywhere in the book?
- Does this apparent absence threaten the truth of the book?
- The simple answer is no. Why not?
 - The events of Esther are clearly orchestrated by the Divine hand even though His name is never mentioned.
 - The book contrasts two types of God's people.
 - Esther who was oblivious to God's hand and had to be directed into the path of His will.
 - Mordecai who quickly realized that God had provided a possible solution before the problem had materialized.

Application: Remember that God works all things for good to those who love Him!
